Side-event « Focus on the meetMED II project: Decarbonization of the building and household appliance sectors »

Introduction

In the framework of the first edition of the Decarbonization Forum organized in Tunis from September 24th-25th, 2024, the meetMED II “Mitigation Enabling Energy Transition in the Mediterranean region” project funded by the **European Union**, **MEDENER**, and **RCREEE**, in cooperation with the **Tunisian National Agency for Energy Conservation – ANME**, is hosting a side-event on “Decarbonization of the building and appliances sectors in the Mediterranean Region”.

Gathering speakers and experts from the Energy Management Agencies affiliated to the meetMED project, this side-event will present the main objectives and actions taken at the project level, and further dig into the more specific subjects of:

- Fostering decarbonization policies and strategies of the building sector at country and regional level;
- Pushing for North-South cooperation, notably at the local level, to share good practices in terms of decarbonization of buildings;
- The importance of the public building stock, notably schools, in implementing RE and participating in achieving the goal of carbon neutrality;
- The success story of the ACTE program and the relevance to replicate such programs in other countries/municipalities of the Mediterranean Region.

Objective

How is the meetMED II project fostering the decarbonization of the Building and Appliance sectors in the Mediterranean Region, and contributing to the goal of carbon neutrality by 2050?

Key messages:

- 1) There is a need to foster the harmonization of RE and decarbonization strategies and policies in the Mediterranean Region
- 2) There is need to increase the share of RE, especially within the building sector
- 3) Role of the local/municipality level in the decarbonization of the building sector
